**Minutes of the meeting of the Academic Committee held on 27<sup>th</sup> January, 2017 at 11:30 a.m. at the Office of the Medical Council of India, Dwarka, New Delhi**

- 9. Note form UG Section regarding letter and requests from Dr. Indrajit Khandekar, on (a) Forensic Medicine (FMT) teaching to be taken to later part of clinical years, (b) posting in FMT to be a part of Internship Programme, (c) steps to increase PG admission in FMT.**

Dr. Indrajit Khandekar, Sewagram, Wardha vide his RTI application dated 29.07.2016, enclosing a copy of Hon'ble High Court of Madras Order dated 16/02/2008 has requested for documents / Records depicting for action to be taken by the Medical Council regarding (1) teaching of Forensic Medicine to be in later part of clinical year (shifting the subject to final year) to facilitate a better understanding of nuances of Forensic Medicine, (2) compulsory posting of Interns in the department of Forensic Medicine for a reasonable period for a better comprehension of the subject and (3) that MBBS students should get familiarized with practical intricacies of Forensic Medicine apart from Academic/Theoretical knowledge.

**The Academic Committee recommended that the Expert Group on Forensic Medicine may look into the above three issues raised by Dr. Indrajit Khandekar urgently for the further consideration of the Academic Committee.**
