Subject: Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Renewal of recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for O1 seat and DGO qualification for O2 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr BR Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore.

Sr/ Madam,

I am directed to state that the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee of this Council at its meeting held on 23.06.2017 considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (25/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 25/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for O1 seat and DGO qualification for O2 seats at Dr BR Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore. The Committee decided as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Compliance Verification Assessment Report (25/05/2017) along with the Council Assessor's Report (July, 2016) and compliance dated 25/01/2017 submitted by the college authorities and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for O1 seat and DGO qualification for O2 seats granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of students being trained at Dr BR Ambedkar Medical College, Bangalore because of the following facts-

1. Dr. Shashik Sathy is promoted as Professor & HOD after cut-off date; however, in the column of "Benefit of juniorizations in the priority table, it is stated "No" implying NLE publications against requirement of 4. Hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered. No experience details have been given about previous posts without which her eligibility cannot be decided.
2. Dr. Vinod Kumar Kumar, Senior Resident in Unit 1 has experience of only 8 m as Junior Resident before appointment as Senior Resident, hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
3. Dr. Madhura Saha, Senior Resident in Unit II does not have any experience as Junior Resident in a medical college affiliated teaching hospital before appointment as Senior Resident, hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
4. CPD attendance on day of assessment till 2 p.m. was only 94 which is inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies are pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats (i.e. MS(OBG) for O1 seat and DGO for O2 seats till amount of their recognition will be irregular/illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall normally result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted to HOD of the MMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall normally result in stoppage of admissions to the Postgraduate Course. In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter and adequately prove to meet admission as per the number of recognition can be timely decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

In case, no compliance is received within this period or compliance is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission.

Please also note that Compliance/ Compliance Verification report should be submitted only in the SAF prescribed for this purpose (available on MCI website i.e. www.mcindia.org), which should include the faculty table (entire faculty including those who has been already verified). Information in any other format will not be accepted.
