Sub: -Your letter No. MCI-201(EC16-16418)/2017-Eligi/179740 dated 27/03/2017

My son Abhjeet Dixit is disappointed and disheartened to receive the above said letter whereby your good selves have rejected the application of my son for issuance of eligibility under Sec 13(4)(b) of the I.M.C. Act, 1956. The said denial is only on ground that the my son has not undergone two years of regular study in English, Physics, Chemistry, and Biology taken together from a recognized Institution/Board.

That my son completed his intermediate examination as private student from the Board of High School and Intermediate Education, U.P in the year 2015 with 90/100 in Biology. Further he obtained 86% marks in Physics, 70% marks in Chemistry and 74% marks in English and as such passed the Intermediate Examination with almost 75%.

After passing the intermediate examination, my son sought admission of Nanfang Medical University, P R Chinato pursue MBBS Degree from the said College & my son had duly applied for issuance of Eligibility Certificate. The instant letter rejecting the issuance of Eligibility Certificate is not only highly belated and against equity but also against the rules prescribe under law.

As per clause 4(2)(b) of the Regulation of the Council on Graduate Medical Education, 1997 no candidate shall be allowed to be admitted to the MBBS course until he/she has passed qualifying examination as under:

*"the intermediate examination in Science off an Indian University / Board or other recognized examinee body with Physics, Chemistry, Biology which shall include a practical test in the subject and also English as compulsory subject."*

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
